

EXPORT DEMAND STEADIED WHEAT

New Crop is Wanted Abroad Corn and Oats Shared Firmness.

CHICAGO, April 30.—Development of a good export demand for new crop winter grades had a rallying influence today on the wheat market as a whole. In the end prices were firm at the same as last night to 1/2c higher.

Export sales of new crop winter wheat have aggregated 500,000 bushels. In addition 50,000 bushels of old No. 2 hard wheat reported as having been sold to Baltimore for ocean shipment with 50,000 bushels more virtually accepted.

Important conspicuous shorts turned corn prices up, after an early period of weakness. Efforts to dislodge holders of May options were, for the most part, a failure, although deliveries tomorrow promise to be large.

Oats had a rally with corn and wheat. It was said most of the deliveries of oats tomorrow would be taken by shippers. Provisional felt the effect of the revived strength in grain.

NO REPETITION OF GUN-RUNNING

Asquith Says Preventive Measures Have Been Taken by Government.

Canadian Associated Press Cable. LONDON, April 30.—Like the stray shots which the imagination depicts as following a hot engagement, even when the "cease fire" order has been given, a few questions over Ulster were addressed to the premier this afternoon from the opposition benches.

The questions asked little, however, to the stock information. The air of the commons was like the weather outside—quite considerably cooler in the past 24 hours.

As to measures dealing with gun-running, the premier stated that measures had already been taken which he hoped will prove effective to prevent the recurrence of such incidents.

Sir William Byles, who had raised the matter, wanted to know some more explicit, but the premier was not to be drawn into details, merely saying that it was not desirable just now to make any public statement, a third attempt of the inquisitive knight, was just as fruitless.

This was really all the Ulster matter of importance that came before the house early settled down to a much less interesting subject.

LOOK OUT FOR COUNTERFEIT NOTES. Spurious Ten-Dollar Bills of Bank of Commerce Circulating in Hamilton.

Counterfeit \$10 notes of the Canadian Bank of Commerce of the issue at present in use are circulating in Hamilton. The counterfeiters, which have so far been seen, are numbered 452,477 in red over black, whereas the genuine notes now issued by the bank are numbered in blue. The colors used are also much deeper in tint than those of the genuine notes, especially the yellow and red on the face. On the back, which are two or three flaws in the design, apparently made by blots which do not appear on the foot of the note. The counterfeiters are counterfeited by H. O'Reilly.

LET'S CABARETS RETAIN LICENSES

Judge Charbonneau Quashes Recent Decision of Montreal License Board.

Canadian Press Despatch. MONTREAL, April 30.—The fact that the judgment of the license commission revoking the licenses of four restaurants where cabaret shows were held was published in the newspapers here before the cases were finally decided upon, figures as a reason that has caused the decision of the commission to be quashed by Judge Charbonneau.

The restaurants affected are the Regal, Parisian, Arbour and the Arlington, all of which have been denounced in the pulpits in the city. His lordship commented rather bitingly on members of the bench who allowed themselves to be influenced by the public opinion of the moment and averred that such public opinion should play no part in influencing the decisions of a court of law.

Discussing the premature publication of the commission's decision, his lordship recalled that a special enactment had been passed forbidding jurors to have communication with outsiders in the course of trials which were going on before them. He added that it might not be out of place that a similar provision be incorporated into the law to apply in the case of judges.

The judge said that when the law-Abattor Commission was a copy of papers containing the judgment, signed by Judge R. Stanley Weir, one of the license commissioners, was given to them.
