The station equipment is of the latest and most perfect type on the market and consists of a swinging arm transmitter and head band receiver for each way station, thus giving the operator the free use of his head, hands and body while using the telephone; the apparatus is swung to one side out of the way while not in use. The train despatching office is equipped with a selector system for calling offices, and the duration of the ring in each station is controlled by the despatcher, who plainly hears the ring thru his receiver.
