A fairly active enquiry was shown for both cattle and small meats. Best butchers' stock sold at 3%c to 4c per lb., live weight, which is an advance of ½c over last week's prices. Lower grades ranged from 2c to 3½c, according to quality. Sheep and lambs were in light supply, and calves came forward freely. Following was the general range of quotations: Cattle—Butchers' choice, per lb., 3%c to 4c, live weight; do., medlum to fair, do., 3c to 3½c, do.; do., culls, do., 2c to 2%c.
