### WHEAT FUTURES UNSTEADY

Chicago Market Rather Heavy Yesterday.

Northwest Receipts Were Heavy and the Increase in the Visible Supply Last Week Was Large - European Wheat Crops and Requirements - Notes and Gossip.

Monday Evening, Sept. 19. On the Liverpool board today spot wheat closed at 1d. in price, another week's advance in the visible supply, and a steady influence, but the statistics regarding the visible supply, together with large Northwest receipts and a lack of speculative buying, caused a net decrease of 1/2 cent to 3/4 cent to 1 cent per bushel for the day.

The Chicago wheat market today was irregular, with a weak tendency. Good buying for foreign account, and an advance in the cash article at Duluth had a steady influence, but the statistics regarding the visible supply, together with large Northwest receipts and a lack of speculative buying, caused a net decrease of 1/2 cent to 3/4 cent to 1 cent per bushel for the day.

Peaches sold at 75c to 85c per basket for choice and 40c to 50c per basket; apples, 10c to 15c per bushel, and 15c to 25c per bushel; peaches, 30c to 50c per basket; eggs, 10c to 15c for small baskets, and 15c to 25c for large baskets; cucumbers, 40c to 50c per bushel; tomatoes, 50c to 60c per bushel; mushrooms, 50c to 75c per case and 20c to 30c per basket for shrimps and 10c to 15c per bushel; egg plant, 50c per bushel, and celery, 35c to 40c per doz.
