Exhibition Buildings.

For the Art Gallery Building, at the Exhibition grounds, tenders totaling a cost of \$6594 were accepted, and contracts awarded as follows: Carpentering, A. B. Coleman, \$2950; plastering, J. M. Gander, \$1443; roofing, Douglas Bros., \$1625; painting, Faircloth & Co., \$210; moulding, J. McCausland & Son, \$241; wiring, Jarvis & Burke, \$70; plumbing, Keith & Fitzsimons, \$55.

The architect of the building is Beaumont Jarvis.

No action was taken in regard to dairy building, and the main building. 
