WEEKLY REVIEW.

This week closes quiet, with only a few changes in values since our last weekly report.

Wheat shows no change.
Oats had a big drop early on in the week. Quite a good trade was done at the decline. Today there was a slight reduction. The price point for the week was 80c; today 83c to 85c was paid.

Very little peas or other kinds of grain offered.

Eggs were scarce and sold readily at 11c to 12c for fresh in basket lots.

Butter got a set-back. On Saturday and Tuesday receipts were too heavy for the demand, and lower prices had to be accepted. Best rolls closed at 15c to 16c; crock, 14c to 15c, wholesale.

Turkeys brought 7c to 9c per lb; until today they sold at 9c to 10c; the supply was moderate. Geese were plentiful, at 5c by the lot. Ducks sold at 60c to 80c a pair.

The supply of beef and lamb was good—some days too good. Prices were barely steady. Dressed hogs ruled firm at \$5.25 to \$5.35 for light, and \$4.75 to \$5 for heavy.

Apples sold at 25c to 75c a bag; supply fair.

Deliveries of potatoes were heavy; the sample was varied; some very good lots came in, and some just as poor. The range was 55c to 65c by the load, and 55c to 70c by the bag.

Hay—Sales ranged from \$6 to \$7 a ton.

Live hogs sold at \$3.90.
