Orange Marmalade.—Slice very thin, rind and all, three large seedless oranges, and one lemon. Pour over the sliced fruit eleven tumblers of cold anges, and one lemon. Pour over the sliced fruit eleven tumblers of cold water, and set away for twenty-four hours. Then boil slowly for one hour. After boiling, add four pounds of granulated sugar, and set away for twenty-four hours longer, then boil for one hour and twenty minutes, or perhaps a little longer. Pour into jelly glasses. This amount will fill eight glasses. Cover with paraffine. The total cost of the marmalade is not more than seventy-five cents, glasses included, and here are eight presents provided for that ridiculous small sum.

Fruit Cake.—Cream together one and one cupful of butter. Add the well-beaten yolks of six eggs, and one and one fourth cupfuls of sifted flour. one-half cupful of pound cloves and one teaspoonful each of powdered cinnamon and nutmeg. Then add the stiffly beaten whites of the eggs and another cupful of flour. Add one-half pound of currants, one-fourth of a pound of citron, one-half cupful of cheread elmonds and a little chopned.


