ASKING UNSTATED DAMAGES

Widow of Joseph Coop suing Robt. Simpson Company.

Mr. Justice Hodgins in the assize court yesterday heard evidence in the case of Mrs. Jessie Coop, who is suing the Robert Simpson Company to recover unstated damages for the death of her husband, Joseph Coop.

On July 9, 1916, a collision occurred between a motor truck belonging to the defendant company, and a motorcycle driven by David Lowrey, as a result of which Mr. Coop, who was riding as a passenger in the sidecar attached to the motorcycle, received such injuries as to cause his death.

On Friday last Lowrey appeared in the assize court and was fined \$100 for being grievously bodily harmed while the jury returned a no bill on an indictment charging Edward Whitten, the driver of the motor truck, with manslaughter. The case will proceed today.
