deposit. Ton will note from a copy of Er. Nolan's
letter to the Department, dated the 16th of May, 1924,
that he made a certain specific request, and if granted,
and if further failure resulted, he stated he would not
complain if the Department algoed him ont. This request
may granted by the Department, and as neual, without any
improvement in the situation, but nevertheless. Hr. Nolan
has continued to make domand through various parties
from the laine for a refund of his deposit.
I have given this matter consideration on a number of
concains, and it is no opinion that the Department
would not be justified in view of the emisting sireumstances in meeting Mr. Nolan's request to have his
deposit returned.
