FULL ALLOWANCE FOR THE SPEAKER

Legislature's Consideration For W. B. Dickson, M. P., P., in His Illness—Clerk Also to Get Salary

(Special to Times.)

Fredericton, N. B., May 2.—The absence of Speaker W. B. Dickson, M. P., for Albert, who has been seriously ill for some time at his home in Moncton, will receive not only his seasonal allowance of \$600, but also the speaker's full allowance of \$400. Mr. Dickson's health was not so good as might have been during last session and the legislature has shown its sympathy and consideration for him by not reducing the amounts he would have enjoyed and earned had he been able to attend to his duties.

Mr. Melanson, M. P., from Shediac, has attended to the duties of acting speaker with much acceptance. He is to receive \$200 for the additional work imposed upon him and his assistant chairmen, Messrs. Munro and Young, will get \$25 each. They are both good chairmen and know the duties of that position by heart.

The acting clerk, Geo. Y. Dibble, who was down in the estimates for a salary of \$700, was allowed only \$25 additional. Henry Rainford, whose serious illness prevented his attendance as clerk of the house, will receive his usual salary of \$1,000. G. Hudson, Flewelling who was promoted from chief sessional clerk to being clerk assistant in the house was allowed \$75 more than he would have received on his regular salary.
