

CARDS. LOSE LEAD AFTER HOLDING IT ONE DAY

PIRATES AGAIN OUT FRONT IN LEAGUE RACE

St. Louis Splits With Braves; Pittsburgh Pastes Brooklyn Hurler

NEW YORK, Aug. 25 — After breathing the restless air at the peak of the National League, for one whole day unmolested, the St. Louis Cardinals are again chewing dust in the wake of the world champion Pirates. The Cardinals went back to work yesterday, against the Boston Braves, after a rainy day's rest, with the temporary crown perched over a cocky eyebrow, and a lead of almost a point in the mad scramble for honors in the elder circuit.

Something in their attitude must have peeved Larry Benton, for the

tribal ace flipped a paralyzing brand of baseball in the first game of their double header. Only four shingles glanced from the Cardinal bats, while the warriors placed old Bill Sherdel now and then for enough to squeeze out a 2 to 1 victory.

In the meantime the Pirates were handing Sunlight Grimes, their former spitball nemesis from Brooklyn, a 10 to 1 pasting. It was Ray Kremer's fourteenth victory of the season, and admitted the Pirates to first place again.

ST. LOUIS SPLITS.

Although St. Louis managed to nose out a six to five victory over the Braves in the second half of the twin bill, they could do no better than climb back into a second place tie with Cincinnati, from third place, where they had reckoned for an hour or so, while the Reds were running their string of wins to ten by defeating the Giants again 4 to 3.

The Chicago Cubs were mean to the tail-end Phillies, taking a pair of games 9 to 4 and 9 to 0. "Black" Wilson got his nineteenth homer of the season.

RAIN INTERFERES.

Rain stopped all but one contest in the American League. Rookie Crowder held St. Louis to three hits, until the seventh and Washington beat back the Browns 9 to 6.

The chances for Canadian representation in the "Little World Series" were considerably brightened when Toronto took two games from Jersey City, 4 to 2 and 3 to 0, while Baltimore was splitting a double bill with Rochester. The Leafs gained a full game in the International Circuit, Syracuse defeated Reading while Newark handed two setbacks to Buffalo.

How To Swim

JUST LIKE FALLING OFF A LOG.

FIRST get thoroughly used to going in head first. At first the hand will fly wildly up, but try to keep them on the knees until the head enters the water.

The first exercise is simple, but will take nerve to try for the first half dozen times. This is going to keep one busy for some time, but stick to it and it will come.

Stand on the edge of the springboard or float and bend down until the palms rest on the knees. There will be a tendency to draw back after the body begins to fall and the body will straighten out—but stick to it and eventually the position will be maintained.

Keep an easy position without tension and fall over into the water.

CANDIDATES SPEAK AT ALBERT MEETING

Colonel MacLaren and Thomas Bell Discuss Campaign Issues

HOPEWELL HILL, Aug. 24 — Lieut.-Col. Murray MacLaren and Thomas Bell, Conservative candidates for Saint John-Albert, addressed a public meeting in Oulton Hall, Albert, this evening which was attended by a fair-sized audience considering the state of the weather and other unfavorable circumstances. An important Masonic meeting with a large number of visitors from Saint John and elsewhere was held at the same hour and in the same building. This was a conflicting circumstance that was somewhat unfortunate from the standpoint of attendance at the political meeting.

Dr. MacLaren spoke about three-quarters of an hour and Mr. Bell a somewhat shorter time. O. A. Reid, of Albert, acted as chairman. Dr. MacLaren dealt chiefly with the questions of tariff, transportation and the customs charges so prominent in the Conservative campaign addresses. Mr. Bell spoke at some length of the cause of dissolution. He claimed that a good deal of the responsibility rested on a member of the late House who broke

his pair. But for this he doubted if there would have been an election at this time.

A pleasing feature of the meeting was a solo by Earle Spicer from Saint John and one by DeWitt Cairns, of Saint John, who were visitors at the Masonic meeting. Dr. MacLaren and Mr. Bell spoke in Hillsboro last evening.

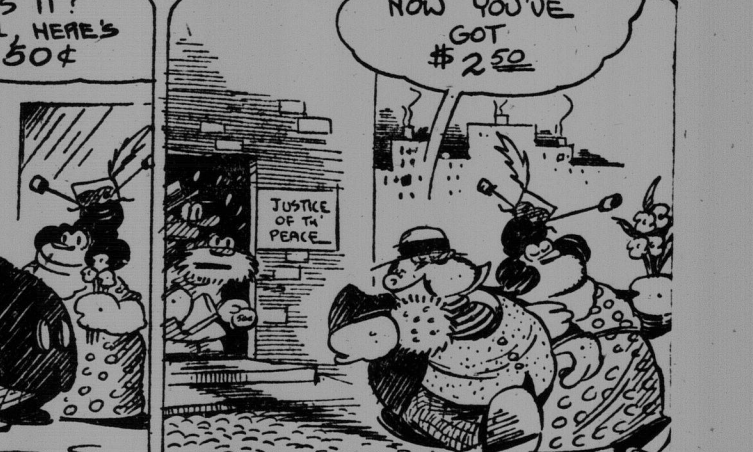
