Washington, Feb. 1.—Sewing machines and knitting needles suspended action when Rear Admiral Newton A. McCully and his adopted family of seven Russian children appeared at the Russian Embassy, where a group of fashionable women had gathered for their weekly meeting of the sewing class in aid of Russian refugees.

Holding the hand of a five-year-old girl, Admiral McCully commended the work of this sewing class and its parent organization, the Central Committee of Russian Relief, which has headquarters in New York.

as a lover of children, spoke of the simplicity of the Russian character as one of the traits most worthy of preservation.

The nurse in charge of the children held the two youngest near by. Another small girl, evidently accustomed to being made much of, was reconciled to leaving the admiral's side by the aid of the ladies of the class holding her on her knee and attaching a wrist-watch to the small arm.

Six of the seven children were American-made sailor suits of blue serge to which their substitute parent declared they were clearly entitled by their eighteen days at sea.

In reply to a question as to his intended method of education, Admiral McCully said he purposed for the next five years to bring up the children as though they were his own. At the end of that time if the elder ones desired to return to Russia he would enable them to do so, or if any had been claimed by now unknown kindred he would return them to the claimants later.

Following the brief talk the admiral was the centre of a short reception when the ladies of the sewing class went back to their tasks. This work, now in its third season, carried on in the dining room of the former embassy, with Mrs. Edward W. Root, daughter-in-law of the former senator from New York, in charge. Mrs. Robert Lansing is chairman of the Washington branch, Mrs. Livingston Farrand treasurer, and Mrs. Sherman Miles secretary.

Later in the day Admiral McCully called with his family at the Navy Department, where they were received with due ceremony by Secretary Daniels. Before returning to their home in a street car, they called on the Secretary of the Department of Labor. The children will be legally adopted by the admiral according to the law of South Carolina in his home state.

N. S. INQUIRY

Halifax, N. S., Jan. 31.—Evidence that V. J. Caviechi, manager of the Bedford Construction Company, the contractors engaged in the building of the various highways in Nova Scotia, at present under investigation by a Royal Commission, had offered money to John W. Rowland, the chief engineer of the provincial highways board, and had proposed to James Kennedy, a sub-contractor engaged in clearing the right of way for the St. Margaret's Bay road, that he paid his pay sheets, was adduced at this afternoon's session of the board.
