

RECRUITING WAS BEGUN HERE TODAY; ORDERS OUT FOR THE WHOLE DOMINION

Report Today Says Colonel McAvity's Regiment Likely to Go—A. M. C. Men From Here to Halifax—Ottawa Details of Cost—May Be Early Session

The call to arms has been sounded again in Canada. Already in St. John usans are anxiously awaiting the opportunity to enlist those who, through business, personal, or varied reasons, were unable to enroll with the first expeditionary force.

With the announcement that there would be a second contingent, the nucleus of an infantry regiment, was immediately formed in this city when Col. J. L. McAvity, O. C. the 62d regt. St. John Fusiliers, enlisted for foreign service the home company of fifty-nine men who have been doing local defence duties since the departure of the first body to go from here.

On the estimate that it costs \$300 to equip each soldier with summer and winter garments, rifle, bayonet, ammunition, kit, etc., it will cost the country upwards of \$24,000,000 to equip the 80,000 men. This does not include uniforms, motor trucks, signaling instruments, reserve ammunition and hundreds of other details of equipment necessary to complete the force.
