This Society, numbering forty-eight members, holds weekly meetings during the winter months, which are well attended. (1) The members visit from house to house among applicants for work from the Industrial Rooms. (2) They prepare work for the Bazaars in aid of the Hervey Institute and the Industrial Rooms. (3) They make clothing for the inmates of the Hospital, as for example, dressing-gowns for the adult patients, and blouses for the children's ward. (4) They assist in the cooking of soups, beef-tea and jelly to be distributed to invalids under the auspices of the Young Women's Christian Association. (5) They also visit the deserving poor at their homes, and supply them with clothing, medicine, and nourishing food. (6) They have sent clothing and money to assist the Protestant settlers in the Namur district, where much suffering has existed in consequence of the failure of crops. (7) In connection with the Young Women's Association they held a very pleasant and successful Social Meeting in the course of this winter.
