SPANISH QUEEN IS GOOD HOUSEKEEPER; LOVING MOTHER, AND ENJOYS SEWING



QUEEN VICTORIA IN HER SEWING ROOM. It is said that the Queen of Spain is the proudest mother in all Europe that not even the humblest mother among her royal consort's subjects lavishes more care and attention upon her own little ones than does Queen Victoria. She has three children—two boys and one girl. On May 21, it will be five years since the English princess was led to the altar by the Spanish ruler. Queen Victoria, as may be imagined from the above, is a very home-like sort of a person, and this notwithstanding the fact that the king is a notoriously unfaithful husband and spends little of his time with his family. The queen takes great delight in attending to her household affairs; and is quite in love with her sewing and embroidery work, making many dainty things for her children and for charity. Just now she is very busy planning for the coronation of her uncle, King George, which ceremony both she and her husband will attend, and in which she will be a most interested person, for she looks upon her native land with longing eyes, and would like to live there once again.

ELOQUENT LECTURE BY A SOCIALIST MEMBER

C. M. O'Brien, M. P. P. for Rocky Mountains District of Alberta, Spoke in the Unique Theatre Last Night. C. M. O'Brien, M. P. P. for Rocky Mountains, Alberta, delivered an able lecture on Socialism, in the Unique Theatre last evening. J. W. Eastwood presided and there was a big audience including a large percentage of small business men. A thousand organizations, said Mr. O'Brien, had sprung into existence to deal with the prevailing social unrest. Formerly the millinaire hypnotized our forefathers into the belief that their wealth came from heaven. Now the kids wanted to know where and how the millinaire got his wealth. Under slavery, class exploitation depended on the ownership of men. Under feudalism the baron owned the land and they gave him much power over the products of labor as if they had owned the serfs. Under capitalism a small number of people owned the machinery of production. This machinery of production represented the accumulated knowledge and labor of thousands of years. Yet a few men control it. Two-hundred men in Canada had it in their power to say whether the big industries should be kept in operation or not. The men who controlled the railways, steamboats and other arteries of commerce owned the products of earth. The farmer and business men might have title deeds to various kinds of property, but they merely amounted to a certificate to a steady job. Like the laborers they were merely wage-earners, selling not hay or boots, but their life-force or labor-power. As to Socialism the speaker said that it was the new science of sociology, developed by the laboring class in order to express the point of view of the workingman. The capitalist had taught the workers various kinds of science, when by so doing the efficiency of the laborer was increased. But they had not taught them the true science of sociology, because it was not advisable to reveal the system of labor exploitation. Moreover the capitalist could not get at the fact, because it was not their material interests to do so. History as taught in the schools gave false impressions. The great man theory had been exploded. Yet school histories deal almost wholly with the doings of alleged great men. The materialistic conception of history was the only true one. Turning to the question of surplus value, the speaker said that if the workers were taught to measure values as they were taught to measure lumber, capitalism would soon fall. Labor was the source of value. A gold mine at the north pole would be of no value, because labor could not be sent to it.
