Manchester-Robertson Allison, is a

speaker who it is said, holds her au-
dience spellbound, while she tells the
story of the great movement to se-
cure votes for women in England. Miss
Pankhurst is an artist but she has set
aside her special work to engage in
suffragette movement now going on in
England. Her zeal in the cause led
to her arrest and imprisonment in Hol-
loway Jail. As a result of her
imprisonment she has pledged her-
self to the work of prison reform, the
need of which she saw was very
great.

Though very youthful, Miss Pank-
hurst is a most convincing speaker and
is possessed of a charming personal-
ity.
