SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any man over 18 years of age, who has been a resident of the Dominion of Canada for at least one year or Alberta. The applicant must acquire 160 acres of land in the Dominion Land Agency of Sub-agency for the district. Entry by pre-emption is made at any agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteaders.
Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of two years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres and receive and occupy by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
Pre-emption—A homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of his homestead. Price \$20 per acre.
The homesteader must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of two years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homesteaded quarter-section).
A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a portion of his homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties—First year, six months in each of three years, cultivation of 1/4 acre and erect a house worth \$200.
