"It is by a union of the nations, the parliament and the government, that we will pursue the war to the end to a victory that will drive the enemy from all invaded territory; from that which has suffered from invasion for several months, as well as that that has suffered it for so many years."

"France has not disturbed the peace. Resisting all provocation, she did everything possible to maintain it. It was premeditated aggression, that an acophism can ever succeed in justifying, that imposed war upon her. She accepted war without fear, and she will not cease the struggle until the enemy has been mastered. It is only when right shall have been restored by victory, and when she shall have obtained every guarantee for a durable peace that France will sign a beace. This we and the allied nations will reach by a close union. Every day tightens the bonds that unite them—bonds further strengthened by the adhesion of Japan to the agreement of Sept. 5, 1914, by which the powers undertook a solemn engagement not to conclude peace separately.
