LONDON, July 29. The German Government is actively engaged in negotiations for the suppression of Carlist insurrections. It has exchanged opinions with the Russian Government, but the Czar is opposed to intervention. Germany is now trying to bring about a concurrence of the great powers in recognition of the Spanish Republic.

The Portuguese authorities have taken a five measures to prevent violation of the frontier by Carlists.

BURLINGTON, Vt., July 29. An unprecedented rain storm commenced here on Sunday, and up to midnight last night, four inches had fallen, and it is still raining. Telegraph wires in this section are prostrated, and no damage from the storm has yet been reported.

NEW YORK, July 29. The announcement of the successful negotiation of the new loan has been without material effect on the Wall Street markets, except loss in firmer and advancing from 100 to 109 1/2. Exchange unchanged.

LONDON, July 30. WILLIAM TO VISIT VICTOR. Emperor William of Germany is to visit Italy the present year, probably in the autumn.

THE GERMAN FLEET. The German squadron will leave British waters about the middle of August for its new station.

INTERFERENCE IN SPAIN. The Paris Le Temps states that England, Germany and Italy have agreed to establish a joint surveillance over the Spanish frontier.

THE BERLIN PROVISIONAL CORRESPONDENCE has expressed the hope that the visit of the German squadron to the coast of Spain will effect a happy change in Spanish affairs.

THE TURK. In England, yesterday, the Goodwood stakes were won by Stumps. Cambuslang was second, and Redoubt third.

LIFE LEGISLATORS. In the French Assembly yesterday the vote on Leon Deville's motion for a dissolution was defeated, 332 to 374.

NEW YORK, July 30. ACCIDENTS. By a railroad accident on the Mobile and New Orleans railroad an engineer and fireman were killed.

It is supposed that two lives were lost by the collision of the steamer Schuyler with a tug boat on the Hudson yesterday. Three men were killed and a boy fatally injured by the explosion of a powder magazine attached to a powder mill near Tannock, Penn.

The castora train leaving Montreal, Tuesday night, ran into a freight train near Solitaire and was badly telescoped. Two engines, a Pullman car and a mail car were considerably smashed. The conductor and several other persons were injured, but no one was killed.

(Special to the News) OTTAWA, July 29. To-night's Citizen says the Secretary of State for the Colonies has kindly offered to act as Arbitrator between British Columbia and the Dominion Government for the settlement of the dispute regarding the terms of the proposed boundary line between the two territories.

Mr. Mackenzie's reply will depend greatly on the view the Northern Pacific Railway Company may entertain on the subject.

The Governor General has reached Parry Sound. A Convention of leading Ontario and Quebec lumbermen met to-day, and resolved to form a Dominion Lumbermen's Association.

New Ship. Messrs. Hilliard Bros. have on their stocks a large ship just ready for launching. It was their intention to have launched her at noon to-day, but just as the tug boats were coming into position a small piece of the ways was discovered to be out of place, which could not be repaired until low water,

consequently the launch is postponed until midnight. The accident is only a mere trifling in itself, but it is the first time anything of the kind has ever happened to a vessel on their blocks, so near completion. Her dimensions are 185 feet keel, 37 feet 6 inches breadth of beam, 24 feet depth of hold, and she will register about 1200 tons. She was built for D. V. Roberts and others. Captain David Mathias will command her. A charter has not been effected yet, but she will probably load for Liverpool. She is named the Albana, after a river of Damascus. The name, like the names of all the rest of Messrs. Roberts' vessels, begins or ends with the letter A. After her arrival in Liverpool she will be copied and fitted for the East India trade.
