

The Anniversary of the Society was celebrated by the members attending Divine Service at the Cathedral. His Lordship the Bishop of Quebec, the Patron, and the Rev. A. W. Moun-
tain, one of the Chaplains of the Society, performed the service, and the Sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Mackie, also a Chaplain to the Society.
