It is not expected, however, that the price will drop to the pre-war figure, namely 17 cents.

Adulterated Maple Sugar.

On conviction of selling adulterated maple sugar, contrary to the Canada pure food laws two St. Thomas merchants today appeared before Magistrate Maxwell and paid fines of \$25 each and costs with warnings that a second offence of the nature would mean much heavier penalties. The charges were laid by Government Inspector Talbot.

Purifier not cleaned Gas Becomes Noxious.

St. Thomas has been asked by the Government to explain the presence of sulphuretted hydrogen in the manufactured gas supply as discovered by Government Inspector A.P. Nash for the past two weeks. The offense was a serious one, explained by the Superintendent of the St. Thomas works as having been caused through the purifier not having been cleaned for some time. The appearance of the impurity the second week's succession is causing considerable complaint among consumers a number of them declaring that they have lost valuable house-plants through the noxious gas. A complaint of the gas being below the Government minimum standard was filed recently registered by Inspector Nash.
