

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered in Baskatchewan, and Al cepting 8 and 28, not may be homesteaded by son who is the sole h family, or any male even of age, to the extent quarter section of 160 ac or less.

Application for sarry must made in person by the applic sub-Argency for the district Sub-Argency for the district by proxy may, however, be m at any Argency on certain con tions by the father, mother, is haughter, brother, or sister of intending homesteader. Application

DUTIES - (1) At lesst months' residence upon and tivation of the land in each for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required readience duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eichty (80) acree in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint owner-ship in land will not meet this re-quirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farm-ing land owned by himself, must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
