

DE BEAUJEU, GEORGE RAOUL LEOTALE HUMBERT GUICHART
SAUVEUSE. (*Soulanges*).

Descended from Capt. Daniel C. De Beaujeu, Chevalier of the Military Order of St. Louis, who commanded the French forces at the battle of Monongahela, July 9th, 1755, where the English under Genl. Braddock were defeated, and where Capt. De Beaujeu was killed. Fourth s. of the late Hon. G.R.S. De Beaujeu, who succeeded to the title of Count De Beaujeu, of France, and at the time of his death was a life mem. of the L.C. of Can. B. at the Manor House, Coteau du Lac, 22 June, 1847. Ed. in Montreal. M., Sept., 1869, Henriette, eldest dau. of G. M. LaMothe, Esq., of St. Hyacinthe. First returned to Parlt. for present seat in Leg. Assem., P. Q., at g.e., 1871, and re-elected at g.e. 1875. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1878 and 1881. First returned to Commons on the death of the mem. elect., Oct 1882. A Conservative.—*Manor House, Coteau du Lac, P. Q. ; Montreal.*

DE SAINT GEORGES, JOSEPH ESDRAS ALFRED, *B. C. L., M. D.*
(*Portneuf*.)

Third s. of the late Laurent Auzé de St. Georges, Esq., N. P., of Cap. Santé by Adelaine, dau. of the late George W. Allsopp, Esq. seigneur of Jacques Cartier and d'Auteuil, who for many years represented Portneuf (then Hampshire) in the L. C. Assem., and Grand-dau. of the late Hon. Geo. Allsopp, Provl. Secretary of the First Prov. of Quebec. B. at Cap. Santé, 4 Aug. 1849. Ed. at Nicolet Coll. and by private tuition. M., 2nd Feb. 1875, Laura, dau. of Hon. Isidore Thibaudreau of Quebec. Graduated as M. D., at Univ. of Victoria Coll., Cobourg, and received the degree of B. C. L. from Laval University, Quebec, 1880. Is a mem. of the Law firm of Morisset and de Saint Georges, Quebec. Is a Gov. of the Coll. of Physicians and Surgeons of L.C., elected to Parlt at g.e. 1872 and 1874; defeated at g.e. 1878; re-elected to Parlt at last g.e. A Liberal, and opposed to the present Govt.—*Cap Santé, P. Q.*

DESAULNIERS, LOUIS LEON L., *M. D.* (*St. Maurice*.)

Descended from Charles Lesieur, Notary Royal and Solicitor General under the French Govt., and of Francoise-de-Lafond, niece of Pierre Boucher, Governor of Three Rivers. Grandfather was the first Deputy of the Co. of St. Maurice in 1791. Father was also Deputy of the same Co. before the insurrection of 1837, and after the Union of the two Canadas.
