B. in Dalhousie, 1 Feb., 1845. Ed at Dalhousie Grammar Sch. M., in Bathurst, N.B., 7 June, 1866, Elizabeth, dau. of the late John Phillips, Esq. ex-M.P. Has been Clerk of the Peace, Registrar of Probates, and Captain in Restigouche Militia. Is now Clerk of the Municipality of Restigouche. Sat in Ho. of Assem. from g.e. 1878 until 1 April, 1885, when apptd. to L. C. A Liberal.—*Dalhousie, N. B.*

DAVIDSON, ALLAN A., Q. C.

Called to the Bar, N.B., 1840. Apptd. Q.C., 11 Oct. 1880. Is a mem. of the Senate of the Univ. of N.B. An unsuccessful candidate for Northumberland in Ho. of Assem., N.B., at g.e. 1870. Sat for that seat in that House from g.e. 1874, until appointed to L.C., 25 May, 1882. A Conservative.—*Newcastle, N. B.*
