

*Monde*. Retired from journalism in Sept. 1879. President of the Jacques Cartier Bank. Created a Knight of the Order of Pius IX., 30 July 1872, after his return from a visit to Rome, where he had the honor of being admitted to an audience with His Holiness. Took an active part in the organization of the Canadian Papal Zouave contingent, which went to the assistance of the Holy Father, 1868. Was one of the authors of the *Programme Catholique*, first published, April 1871, which was prepared for the purpose of being offered to the Conservative Party as a basis on which the several opposing sections of that Party, then engaged in a warm contest, might agree. First returned to Parlt. for present seat by acclamation at g.e. 1874. Re-elected at last g.e. An Independent Conservative.—*Place Souigny, St. Charles Borromée street, Montreal; Rideau Club*.

DOMVILLE, JAMES. (*Kings, N.B.*)

S. of Major-General James Domville, R.A., by Frances, dau. of Hon. William Usher. B. 29 Nov. 1842. Ed. in Eng. M. 1867, Isabel, dau. of the late William Henry Scovil, Esq., of St. John, N.B. A merchant and manufacturer. Major 8th Regt. Cavalry. Sat as Chairman of the delegation from St. John, N.B., at Dominion Board of Trade, Ottawa, 1871. First returned to Parlt. for present seat at g.e. 1872; re-elected at g.e. 1874, and again at last g.e. DOULL, ROBERT, J.P. (*Pictou*)

Third s. of John Doull, merchant, by Jane Craig, both of Wick, who emigrated to this country in 1828. B. in Wick, Caithnessshire, Scot., in 1828. Ed. at Pictou Academy. M. in 1852 at Pictou, Janet Crichton, dau. of James Crichton, Eng.; grand-dau. of the late Hon. David Crichton, M.L.C. She died in 1869. A Lieut.-Col. of Militia. Was Treas. of Co. Pictou for 15 years. Represented Oddfellows of the Maritime Provinces at meeting of Grand Lodge at San Francisco, 1869. A Dir. of the Pictou Bank. Sat for Pictou in House of Commons from 1872 until 1874. Defeated at g.e. in 1874 by one vote. Again returned at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative and in favor of the N.P.—*Pictou, N.S.*
