A couple of struggling forwards came to life to help the University of Alberta Golden Bear hockey squad defeat the University of Calgary Dinosaurs 6-3 at Varsity Arena on Friday night.

Wingers Doug McCarthy and Todd Gordon had only one goal between them entering the series with Dinosaurs. McCarthy had 24 in 28 games last year and Gordon had 4 in 25, playing on a checking line.

"It was like getting a big monkey off my back," said McCarthy, who scored twice. "I've hit 10 or 11 goal posts and the goalie would be making a big save. I've had two more [goals] called back. It felt good to help the boys out a little." McCarthy hit two more posts on Friday.

Gordon felt relieved, too. "I was pretty excited after I scored," he said

While McCarthy is coming off a fabulous 71 point season, aspirations or a season similar are not on his mind. "Definitely points-wise there's no way I'll end up with the type of season I had last year," he said. "If I help out now and then with a crucial goal I feel I'll be doing my job."

Bear coach Bill Moores was happy to see McCarthy and Gordon score goals. "Both worked really hard," Moores said. "They persevered and when you persevere things start to go in. Doug had hit a lot of posts."


