

themselves but for their individual neighborhoods. Cadillac-Fairview Corporation will again present a trophy to the winning neighborhood.

Folksinger Shirlee Smith, the mime group Fantasy and Fairy Tales and the Big Bad and Ugly Band with Ward 8 Councillor Steve Mahoney will again entertain this year.

Yakachuk, the talking police car, a Mississauga fire truck and McDonaldland characters will delight the youngsters. The Mississauga gymnastics club will perform throughout the afternoon.

Each Erin Mills family with an Erin Mills Homeowners Association (TEMPO) membership card will be given free refreshments tickets. Memberships will be available at the gate for \$2 per household. Residents from outside Erin Mills are welcome to enjoy the events and partake of hot dogs and soft drinks for a nominal charge

The planning and work involved in the picnic is done entirely by volunteers, creating an atmosphere of community spirit and participation which is seldom found in other communities — about 1,200 people attended last year's picnic and 2,000 are expected this year.
