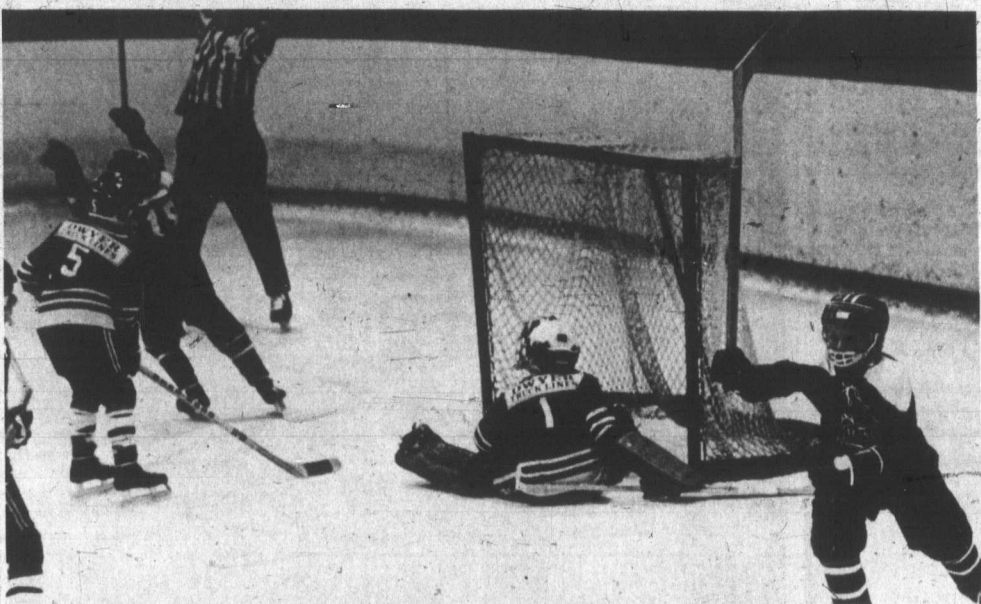
Randy Whelan scored once and earned assists on three other markers. The fifth tally came from John Meade's shot.
