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		April 22nd 1944		Clear. A full day's Flying was put in personnel of Training Wing.																				
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April 24th 1944		Cloudy to partly cloudy. Flying for part of the day only. Course No. 105 commenced flying training on the 24th April, 1944, with an intake of 62 students (54 R.C.A.F. and 8 R.A.F.) Victory Loan Campaign started with a bang. It is felt the Station will double its quota without any trouble																						
April 25th 1944		Rain. Low cloud. One and a half hours Bad Weather Circuits.																						
April 26th 1944		Intermittent to continuous rain, low cloud. Two hours Bad Weather Circuits.																						
April 27th 1944		Clear. Practically a full day's Flying was put in by personnel of Training Wing. Gala Station Dance was held in the Drill Hall. The 16 piece orchestra from Rockcliffe was in attendance and played to a capacity house. Victory Bonds were raffled off before the Dance. A Sports Banquet was held in the Airmen's Mess, prior to the Dance, where trophies for the Winter Sports were presented to the various teams, by the Commanding Officer. This, combined with the Station Dance, made it one of the best evenings the Station has ever had.
