DRAFT ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN THE REPARATION COMMISSION
AND THE GERMAN GOVERNMENT RESPECTING THE APPLICATION
OF THE EXPERTS' REPORT. (Annex 2133-a, b, c).

1. The CHAIRMAN reminded the Commission that on his initiative it had semi-officially decided to attempt the conclusion with the German Government of an agreement on the questions within its jurisdiction without waiting until a general agreement was arrived at between the Governments represented at the London Conference.
2. The German Delegation had announced on the evening before that it had accepted this procedure. At the request of their colleagues, M. Delacroix and Sir John Bradbury had agreed to have a further conversation with the delegates of the German Government in the course of the morning.
3. Sir John BRADBURY drew the attention of the Commission to the fact that the agenda comprised only the examination of the draft laws and the draft control protocol. At the same time it would be desirable to consider in the course of the meeting as a whole all the problems raised since the arrival of the Commission in London, and in the course of the negotiations which had there taken place. In order that there might be no technical breach in the observation of the Commission's standing orders, he proposed that the Commission should

unanimously decide....
