Sir,

With reference to the visit you are about to make to the Garden River Indian Reserve, I beg to request that after you have completed the survey of the block of rocky land applied for to be used as a quarry that you will examine the tract of land shown bordered red on the blue print plan herewith, lying to the West of Echo River, to the East of the surveyed mining claim, 25 H, the quarry claim you are about to survey and the line shown approximately running South from the said quarry claim.

It is not desired that you should make any survey of this tract. You should examine it and report approximately on the areas of good agricultural land situated within the said block and the timber thereon. Should any large tracts of rock occur please ascertain their limits approximately in order that you may be able to indicate them on a sketch. I have also to request you to be prepared if it should be desired to give an opinion as to the value of the land and the timber thereon, examined by yourself. The tract examined is to contain four thousand acres more or less.
