## Sheet 2 SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE D 122916 TPR. AUSTIN, J.D. CONTINUED

Fourth Witness D-82044 Tpr. Hawkins, F.A., 8th Cdn. Recce. Regt., on the Strength of No. 1 C. A.C.R.U., a soldier of the Canadian Prosecution Army, Overseas, having been duly sworn, states as follows:

"At Inkerman Barracks, on 21st July 1942 I was on duty in the Q.M. Office. The accused brought in Twenty-Five clothing coupon booklets. On checking the receipt slip was for Twenty-Seven books, and re-checking the clothing coupom books I received I found there was a deficiency of two books Nos. ZB-485100 and ZB-485101. I told Tpr. Austin I would report the deficiency to S/Sgt. Cuthbert by telephone. This I did."

The accused declined to cross examine this witness.

Fifth Witness for the Prosecution

B-309 Tpr. Gizuk, J., 11th Cdn. army Tank En.,(Ont R), on the Strength of No. 2 C.A.C.R.U., a soldier of the Canadian Army, Overseas, having been duly sworn, states as follows:

"At Inkerman Barracks, Woking Area, on 21st  $J^0$ ly 1942 during lunch hour Tpr. Austin, J.D. came to my quarters for a haircut. While I was cutting his hair he asked me if I would like to buy some clothing coupons, which resemble Exhibit "B", only to my memory the coupons had a cover. I asked him the price. He told me he'd let me have them for five shillings. I did'nt fancy buying them but Tpr. Austin said he needed the money for some special reason. I asked him where he obtained the coupons. He said one of the fellows in the Orderly Room gave them to him to have some clothers. I said the transfer they are returned. buy some clothes. I said, 'In that case they are not stolen?' He said, 'No.' I then purchased the coupons. I then sold them to the Regimental Barber, whom I assisted, as I knew he was getting married and would be interested in acquiring coupons. I sold them to him at a value of ten shillings. He paid me only five shillings as I was indebted to him for five shillings. He asked me if they were all right and not stole. were all right and not stolen. I assured him they were not stolen.
