 having been duly sworn states;

I do not know anyone in this court.
 I remember an accident on the Seachtlaan
 on June, 1945. The evening I had night duty
 two ~~landin~~ ^{work} officers on information received I
 went to the corner of Seachtlaan and breadbushing.
 The ~~young~~ ^{work} The young fellow appeared to be dead. ^{work}
 I only saw the jeep standing in the direction
 towards, next to it a victim was lying on the
 ground. ~~and the~~ ^{work} I then made an
 investigation. This is a very dangerous corner
 and more accidents have happened there. I mentioned
 the signs on the jeep in my investigation. I
 remember that it was 53 registered on the vehicle.
 I arrived there at one o'clock at night. The jeep
 was right on the corner on the road. There were about
 80 people there. There were a lot of soldiers there.
 There had been a party that night. There was
 no one in the jeep. It was heavily damaged.
 I have had experience in dealing with motor
 accidents for 12 yrs. I qualify myself as an
 expert in Holland. I am officially recognised
 as such. The right front wheel had been torn off,
 the radiator had been pushed in, the right and
 left fender was pushed in, the chassis damaged
 on the right side. The front axle was out of
 place. I did not see the driver of the jeep. This
 was on the 6 June 1945. I then brought the
 body to the hospital and made my investigation.
 I did not identify the body at that moment. He
 was not from our congregation. I measured the
 road and continued my investigation. I took the
 body to Algemeene Begraafplaats, 1st
 Eindhoven city. It is a mosque. I have
