

THIRD WITNESS: Mlle Gilberte Libert (hairdresser) No. 29A Rue Edgar Tinel, BRUSSELS, being unable to speak English requires an interpreter. Interpreter (French-English) Capt G Hessey, White, CWAC Cdn Sec HQ Brussels Garrison has been duly sworn.

The witness Mlle Gilberte Libert having been duly sworn states:

"The first time I saw Paul whom I recognize as being in this room, was about 6.45 in the afternoon of the 25 November 1944, when he came to the house at 29A Rue Edgar Tinel Brussels with Mme Simon. He had dinner and left about 9.45 that evening. The next day he phoned in the afternoon about 3.00 o'clock and asked if he could come and sleep there and that he might come with his friend. He arrived alone about 9.00 o'clock in the evening and he had dinner with us. During dinner Madame Simon said they all had to work in the morning and Paul said "In Canada we never get up until 1200hrs", so Madame Simon said she'd leave the keys and he could bring them up to her at the Cafe de la Postewhere she worked when he was ready to leave. Paul stayed all night and I left for work at 8.00 o'clock the next morning. M Simon left before I left, it was about 6.45 I returned about 6.30 in the evening with Mde Simon and I saw the tablecloth was all dirty and the wall had wine spilled on it. I saw a key which is kept in a drawer in the kitchen, lying on the buffet where it shouldn't have been. I told Mde Simon".

The accused declines to Cross-examine.

Questioned by the Officer taking the summary.

Q: Have you ever seen this before? (handing a cigarette case to witness)

A: Yes, it belongs to M Simon.
