### Kerosene Emulsion Kills Mites.

Many chicken growers know what a nuisance the chicken mite is, and they will find the following by J. J. Repp of Iowa, interesting:

The mites live and breed in fissures about buildings and feed upon the fowls when they go upon the nest or perch.

Mites may be introduced into a flock by a fowl or other bearer brought from infected premises. Mites may be exterminated by thoroughly spraying the building and its contents with kerosene emulsion.

Kerosene emulsion kills not only the mites, but also their eggs, when it comes into contact with them.

### Freight Cost in Britain.

The cost of hauling freight per ton per mile on the London North Western Railway, England's most important line, expressed in cents, is 1.49. On the Pennsylvania railway the cost is .404 of a cent and on the New York Central .416 of a cent. This is true, although the wages of English trainmen are but half the American. An eminent expert attributes the greater cost to the rigidity of the four wheeler English freight wagons, which, he says, are "track murderers and power absorbers."

### Coolie Power Car Line.

A curious street car line is that between Atami and Yoshioka, two coast towns in the province of Izie, Japan. The line is seven miles long, the rolling-stock consists of a single car, and the motive power is furnished by a couple of muscular coolies, who push the car along wherever power is necessary.

## TRAINED FOR FIGHT

LEADERS OF THE OPPOSING FORCES IN MACEDONIA.

Now Boris Sarafoff Came by His Hatred of the Turk—something of a Fanatic and Desperado, He Is a Romantic Figure—Rise of Edhem Pasha, Once a Slave, to Command of the Sultan's Army.

The uprising of the Macedonians against Turkish rule and its disastrous results to the Christians have drawn the attention of the civilized world to the unhappy section of Europe ruled by the Sultan and awakened interest in the opposing forces in that blood drenched land.

Boris Sarafoff, chief of the Macedonian revolutionary league, has been variously described as an unprincipled ruffian and a patriot with the highest motives. He is but a little over thirty years of age, but his power in Bulgaria and Macedon-

ia is so great that he has set the whole Balkan peninsula aflame. He has something of the fanatic and something of the desperado about him, but without is one of the most romantic figures in Europe.

His parents were Bulgarian Christians, and his ancestors, who had lived in the little Turkish village in which he was born for more than 200 years, had always been leaders in uprisings against the tyranny of the Turks. While still an infant he was taught to hate the oppressors of his people, and as a boy he began to train himself for his self imposed task of heading a rebellion which in his youthful enthusiasm he believed would be the means of overthrowing Turkish power and of driving the Turk out of Europe.

He studied at the military academy at Sofia and before accepting a commission in the Bulgarian army served six months in the ranks in order to become familiar with the life and duties of a common soldier. He was an officer for a couple of years and then threw himself exclusively into the advancement of the Macedonian cause. Sarafoff organized the Macedonian league, which has figured so largely in all the Balkan troubles of the last few years and which is responsible for the recent outbreaks. This league is a union of many local committees under the direction of an executive at Sofia, Bulgaria.

Each district committee has a staff of voluntary secret agents, and to these agents is entrusted the task of securing the sinews of war. By various methods the Macedonians have secured arms and equipments for a force said to number 15,000 men. They have collected large stores of provisions in the mountains and claim to be prepared for a prolonged campaign.

But the Macedonians have a terrible foe to reckon with in Edhem Pasha, commander of the Turkish troops in the revolting province. Edhem Pasha has an interesting history. He is not only of Greek origin, but also of Christian parentage, though now he is an enthusiastic and fanatical Mohammedan and a loyal subject of the Sultan. The rise of

Edhem Pasha in the service of the Sultan has been remarkable. He was purchased as a slave in his boyhood and sent by his master to the School of Mines in Paris. Returning to Constantinople, he was placed on the general staff and rapidly rose to power. In 1877 he became Grand Vizier and later was minister to Austria.

He fought with brilliancy at Plevna in the Russian war and drove the Greeks out of Thessaly during the Greco-Turkish war. This is the man with whom Sarafoff and his Macedonians must reckon. He is a veteran of many campaigns and is skilled in mountain warfare. Pitted against his Mussulman hordes the little Christian army of Sarafoff seems destined to defeat if not extinction.

### Royal Academy Tragedies.

Buried in the cellars of Burlington House, London, are many pictures—one or two of them huge canvases—that were left undisturbed for years. But when, as a result of almost un-expected activity on the part of the governing body, inquiry was made as to these derelict works of art, many tragedies were revealed.

In the case of two of the pictures—"never claimed and sent down to the cellars," as the printed record goes—the artists who had sent them to the Academy had walked out of London lodgings and had never been seen or heard of again. In two or more cases the artists—a painter and a sculptor, respectively—had committed suicide between the sending in of the works and the hanging of the same. In a great number of cases the pictures in the cellars bear no trace of the real name and address of the painter. Their creators have sent them in anonymously, and then, finding that the works were not hung, have never claimed them.

### The King's Kind Heart.

An interesting story revealing a splendid trait in King Edward's character is attached to a silver inkstand which was long in daily use at Marlborough House, and is now at Buckingham Palace. When Prince of Wales, King Edward one day watched a blind man and his dog vainly trying to cross the road, in the most congested part of Pall Mall. Placing his hand on the man's shoulder the Prince himself conducted the man safely across. A few days later a beautiful silver inkstand arrived at Marlborough House with this inscription. "To the Prince of Wales from one who saw him conduct a blind beggar across the street—in memory of a kind and Christian action." The donor is still unknown.
