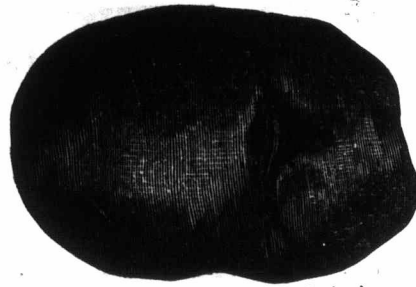


SEEDS!



SELECTED SEED POTATOES

Clark's No. 1. POTATO. (1/2 size.) Clark's No. 1—The seedling originated in New Hampshire; it is said to be earlier than the Rose, and will yield from a quarter to a third more crop. It cooks mealy, is of excellent flavor, and is in every way a capital variety for either the farmer or market gardener. 450 bushels is said to have been raised on one acre, and 22 bushels from one peck of seed. SPRING WHEAT.

Defiance—It displays great productiveness, vigor and hardiness, is a beardless white chaff wheat, with heads frequently five to six inches long, very closely set with large white kernels, frequently numbering 75 to 80 to the single head. 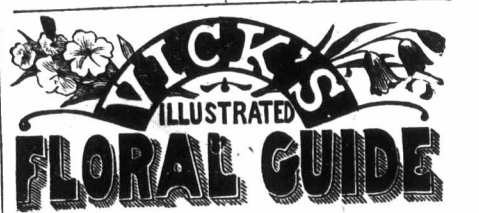
