


South Brant's Candidate For Good Gov't

Here are two of the clauses of Mr. Brewster's Public Utilities Act, which was made law at the recent session of the Legislature.

(1) After the same have first been submitted to and approved of by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council by-laws may be passed by the councils of all municipalities to prohibit the sale or distribution within the municipality of natural or manufactured gas containing sulphuretted hydrogen.

(2) If a company contravenes the provisions of any such by-law or after the passing of such by-law neglects or refuses to furnish sulphuretted hydrogen any right, privilege or franchise which it possesses for the sale or distribution of natural or manufactured gas within the municipality shall ipso facto come to an end and be determined.


