Ketchen Defeats Reeve Griffith.

Wins Out By Small Margin of 10.

Councillors Elect Are Messrs. Breckenridge, Anderson, Rylott and Steenburg.

The fight for the reeveship of Belmont & Methuen on Monday was a strenuous one and practically every available vote was polled. The result elected James Ketchen over his opponent, Reeve Griffith, by the small margin of 10 votes, the result being in doubt until Tuesday noon.

The candidates for the Council also worked at top notch, and all three of the old council were returned, the new member being Gilbert Steenburg. Councillors Breckenridge headed the poll with 223, a remarkably good showing, taking a consistent vote in every sub-division. The following is the result by sub-divisions:
