 PANDERING TO QUEBEC

In his letter to Sir Robert Borden regarding coalition Sir Wilfrid Laurier stated that he could take no definite action until he had consulted with Sir Lomer Gouin. Why Sir Lomer Gouin? Why was it necessary for Sir Wilfrid to consult with the Premier of a province that has done less in the war than any other self-governing portion of the empire?

What has Sir Lomer to do with the Conscription Bill? If Sir Robert Borden had said that it would be necessary for him to consult Sir William Hearst, Premier of Ontario, before he could answer a question what a fuss there would be on both sides of the house, especially from the Quebec contingent.

The people of Canada are getting sick and tired of this eternal submission to the yoke of Quebec. Quebec has been the spoiled child of Confederation. It has assumed more privileges and shirked more obligations than any other portion of the Dominion; and, outside of the English speaking section of Montreal, it has not only fought less but paid less than any other province toward the war.

The time seems to have come in this country for plain speaking. If Quebec desires to reap the benefits of British connection, it must be prepared to sacrifice something for British connection. Thus far English-speaking Canada has done most of the fighting and paying and French Canada most of the talking. It is a condition that cannot and will not be much longer tolerated by the overwhelming bulk of loyal Canadians.

**JUBILEE SERVICES**

The Government of Canada has issued an appeal that all loyal subjects observe the Jubilee of Confederation on July 1st by attending divine services.

United services between the Methodists and Presbyterians will take place as last Sunday. At the evening service special attention will be given to the Story of Confederation, showing what wonderful changes have taken place during the past fifty years.

**GERMAN MINISTER RESIGNS**

LONDON, June 26—Herr Michaelis, the German Minister to Norway, has resigned and is returning to Germany, according to Scandinavian despatches. The Morning Post's Christiania correspondent, however, says that this is not connected with the recent discovery that explosives were being brought into Norway from Germany.

The following official announcement has been made: "The king has deemed desirable, in the conditions brought about by the war, that the princes of his family who are his subjects and bear German names and titles should relinquish these titles and henceforth adopt British surnames.
