BUTTER AND CHEESE MAKING.

Prof. Robertson of the Experimental Farm Ottawa, addressed a representative meeting of the farmers of New Germany yesterday afternoon, on Dairying. He showed the excellent working and profitable nature of the industry and the encouraging results to those engaged in it throughout the Dominion. Many practical questions were asked and answered, and as an outcome of the meeting it is not too much to expect that ere long the people of New Germany will have a practical opportunity to test the merits of the most improved methods of dairying.

Prof. Robertson was followed by Col. C. E. Kaulbach, who referred to the advancement of the dairying industry not only in the Dominion but in the Province, and particularly in the counties of Annapolis, Kings, Antigonish and Cumberland; Annapolis, our sister county having no less than six dairy farms. He also dilated on the adaptability of Lunenburg county for the business, and the necessity for united action and earnest effort on the part of our farmers, particularly those of New Germany, in this direction, urging that as our country were being greatly depopulated by the loss of the young men, it is necessary that we should give to practical dairying, as a result of the impetus given by this meeting we are impressed with the conviction that in a very short time active steps will be taken to place our county in a favorable position in this respect with other counties of the Province.

In the evening Prof. Robertson addressed a meeting in Lunenburg, on the subject of "Our Bread and Butter." The lecture was practical, instructive and entertaining, and it is much to be regretted that the audience, though representative, was not large, a fact largely due to the exceedingly short notice.

WHO SHOULD PAY THE TAXES: LAND OR TENANT?—Was the question the debating society undertook to settle at their last meeting. Those who thought that the tenant should be responsible for the payment of taxes gave as their main reason the fact that it is a great many would not have a vote in town and other elections if it were not for the taxes they paid on the real estate they rented. They held also that, as the money came out of the pockets of the tenants eventually, it gave the tenant a greater feeling of independence to pay the rates to the town directly rather than through the hands of the landlord. It was pointed out, however, that in the two towns in the Province in which the landlord paid the taxes, the privilege of voting was accorded to all who were yearly tenants, and was not made conditional on the payment of taxes on a certain amount of real estate. Those who favoured the landlord side of the question took their stand on four grounds: 1. The landlord was the one most interested in securing the protection which the taxes would pay for, and he was the party most concerned in improving the government and promoting the growth of the town in which his property was situated, since his interests were more bound up with its prosperity than the interests of his tenant, who could sever all connection at a short notice. 2. The taxes could be more easily collected from the landlord, who shifted less than the tenant. 3. Since the taxes came out of the pocket of the tenant even when paid by the landlord, being added to his rent, it was easier for the tenant to pay them to the landlord with his rent instead of bothering with a separate payment. 4. The tenant having a preferential lien on the landlord's real estate had better security if he was held responsible. As a side issue to the above interesting discussion there was an interesting discussion on the exemption of improvements from the taxation. The vote was 16-11 in favour of the landlord.

A meeting of the shareholders of the Central Telephone Co., Ltd., was held at the office of Arthur Roberts, Esq., on the evening of Thursday, the 7th inst. Dr. N. P. Freeman, of New Germany, occupied the chair, and W. M. Duff, Esq., of Bridgewater, acted as Secretary. The secretary reported as follows: The Provisional Directors had presented the accounts showing the cost of construction, the amount of stock sold and the earnings to date. Much satisfaction was expressed by the shareholders in seeing the position of matters and it was decided to continue the sale of stock for the purpose of pushing the line through to Springfield and thence to Middleton which is covered by the company's charter. The present list of the company consists of the pulp mill, Miller's hotel and Andrew Woodworth's (at the railway station), New Germany, and also Bars Corner with Bridgewater. The following directors were elected: N. P. Freeman, M. D., Joseph Hughes, W. M. Duff, Arthur Roberts, W. M. Duff, Dugald Stewart, M. D., and L. C. Gelling, Bridgewater, and also to be nominated by the Nova Scotia Telephone Company who are shareholders in this company. At a subsequent meeting of directors the following officers were elected: N. P. Freeman, M. D., President; Joseph S. Hughes, Vice-president; W. M. Duff, Secretary; Arthur Roberts, Treasurer, and L. C. Gelling, Manager of Construction and Repairs.—Bellefleur.

A large whale measuring 75 ft. in length was captured off Nahant, Mass. On Sunday evening last there was a total eclipse of the moon. The evening was unusually fine, and the heavens very clear, this giving all the onlookers a magnificent view of the various stages of the moon's travel through its orbit. The first shadow was visible at about 10 o'clock, and ere an hour had passed the moon was totally dark. The sight was very interesting, and will be remembered by many. There is to be another total eclipse this year, Sept. 3rd, which will be visible here to better advantage.
