To Boycott a Bank.

Shanghai, July 28.—The native bankers here have called a meeting to discuss a proposal to boycott the International Banking Corporation, which was organized in 1901 under the laws of Connecticut, receiving the charter by a special act of the Legislature. In 1902 it was made the agent of the United States Government for the receipt of the payments on account of the Chinese Boxer indemnity.
