REHABILITATION
OF ALFRED DREYFUS

French Parliament Takes De-
cisive Action To-Day.

PROMOTION AND HONOR

To be Given. Dreyfus—His Friends
Look for Vengeance—Paris
Press Opinions.

Paris, July 13.—This was the
closing day of parliament, and it
was largely devoted to the reha-
bilitation of Alfred Dreyfus, so
that the national holiday to-mor-
row may witness his return to the
army, and the official placement of
stain placed upon his good name.

The Chamber of Deputies met at
9 in the morning for the purpose of
hastening the parliamentary pro-
cedure, and War Minister Etienne
immediately presented two govern-
ment bills one raising Captain Drey-
fus to the rank of major of artillery,
and the other promoting Col.
Picquart to that of brigadier-gen-
eral. M. Etienne asked for speedy
action, adding that it was the
government's intention to inscribe
Dreyfus's name on the list of can-
didates for the cross of the Legion
of Honor.

This announcement brought out
a storm of applause. The bills
were referred to the army commit-
tee, which once into session, ap-
proved them, and drafted strong
favorable reports, which debate lat-
ter. It is expected that both bills
will become law before the close
of the day.

The radical supporters of Drey-
fus are seeking the force the govern-
ment to prosecute the many
generals, colonels and high func-
tionaries responsible for his con-
demnation. The amnesty law pro-
tects them, but a movement is on
foot to repeal this law for the pur-
pose of reaching Generals Mercier,
Gonz, Col. Patty De Cham and
others who were prominent in the
prosecution of Dreyfus.

The government newspapers de-
clare that the affair is closed, but
others, notably the Figaro and
those who were prominent in ob-
taining a revision of the Dreyfus
trial not to attempt to obtain
vengeance.

The Eclair asserts that the ac-
quittal of Dreyfus means that poli-
ticians have seized the judiciary.

The prevailing tone of the press
testifies to the scrupulous integrity
of the court and hails its decision
as a triumph of justice.
