

Glass Walls for Fruit Trees.

An interesting experiment in fruit growing has been recently carried out by the Count de Choiseul, and described in Cosmos. When a south wall is used for fruit trees the north side of the wall is practically wasted as far as fruit is concerned. Count de Choiseul has used a glass wall, and grown fruit trees on both sides. The produce on the north side is little inferior to that on the south.
