The suggestion that the United states become a creditor of Germany by accepting German bonds in lieu of debts the Entente powers owe the United States is popular with the Germans, who have proposed it several times before the recent overtures. It is regarded as unlikely, however, in Berlin official circles, that the United States will seriously consider such a proposition until the Entente and nounce positively the total reparations claims it will attempt to collect from Germany. After this sum is announced financial eperts will be able to judge Germany's ability to pay.
