Bresnan, before the Grand Valley Horti-

Bees and Fruit.—Professor Cushman,  
apiculturist at the State Agricultural Experi-  
ment Station, declares before the Grand  
Island Horticultural Society that bees never  
scented round fruit, but only such as is de-  
termined to be sweetly injured by other  
insects; and his words were indorsed by all  
his auditors.

The Norfolk Grape.—This variety of half-  
foreign origin, sent out some years since as  
an early Catawba, is very subject to mil-  
dew. It ought not to be kept where there  
are any other varieties. It is a mildew  
breeder. It is not worth raising, the qual-  
ity of the fruit is not pleasing and the  
clusters are too large. V. V. V. V. V.  
Pears in West Michigan.—Mr. Lanning  
asked to state what varieties he would  
choose, and how many of each for an  
orchard of 1,200 trees, said this would  
depend according to location. For his own  
farm of gravelly loam with a clay subsoil,  
the clay approaching the surface in places,  
he would choose: 25 Malvern, 100 Clark's  
Favorite, 200 or 25 Bartlett, 200 or 25  
Anjou, 100 Onondaga, 200 Bosc, 100  
Sheldon, 100 Beurré D'Al, and 50 each of  
Goodrich, Winter Nells, Mount Vernon,  
Friedrich's Clay, and Seckel.—  
[Discussions West Michigan Horticultural  
Society.]

Advantages of Drainage.  
We drain to let water enter the soil, as  
much as to take it out.—To make the  
fertilizing rain filter through the soil,  
Drainage makes the soil more porous, drier,  
looser and more friable; it raises the tem-  
perature of the soil, a greater variety of  
crops can be grown; it gives an earlier seed  
time and harvest, and it makes manure more  
effective. On a porous soil the action of  
the drains will extend to a considerable  
distance if the depth is made proportionate  
while on clay soil percolation is greatly  
hindered, and the beneficial effect tends  
to a less distance from the drain. It is the  
weight of water in the soil which exercises  
the effect; a drain has no "drawing" power.  
—[Prof. Scott, in Agricultural Gazette,  
Scotland.]

Fertile Bee Queens.  
The importance of going into winter  
quarters with good fertile queens cannot be  
overestimated. We may go to the trouble  
and expense of putting up a colony in the  
best possible shape, but if it has a few defective  
queens the colony is bound to be a loss. It  
is true we may have a few bees in the hive  
in spring to unite with some other  
colony, but this does not amount to much,  
and the colony is nearly a total loss. Hence  
it is safe to supply every colony that is  
defective in this respect with a good queen.  
If we do not have queens or cannot get  
them then unite with some other good  
colony that had a good queen. This is  
much better than to wait until next spring  
to unite them. Good queens can be had at  
this season very cheaply.

Tuberculosis in the States.  
On the heels of the recent fatal outbreaks  
of Texas fever in Detroit and other northern  
points, the Boston Herald publishes a dis-  
patch from Manchester, N. H., Oct. 9,  
stating that tuberculosis prevails in several  
herds in that vicinity, creating some alarm  
both as regards its spreading among other  
cattle, and also as to the quality of those  
who have been eating milk or meat sup-  
plied before the presence of the disease was  
discovered.
