

The Dominion Whisky Commission

Finish Taking Evidence. Mail Clerk Duffy Acquitted on a Charge of Robbing the Mail-Two More

Charges Against Him.

The royal commission on the liquor question sat again on Saturday in Ottawa, closing their work as far as taking evidence is concerned.

The net gold in the United States Treasury at the close of business on Saturday was \$107,371,060, a gain of \$45,564 since Friday. The cash balance was \$138,139,030. P. J. Duffy, the mail clerk charged with robbing a registered letter of \$520, was on

Saturday found not guilty, and was discharged, but was at once rearrested on two more charges of robbing the mails. On Saturday afternoon a construction train on the Maine Central Railroad collided with a team two miles east from Ellsworth, Me., throwing the caboose and six cars off the track. Nine railway em-

ployes were injured. On Saturday afternoon, while playing in a barn behind St. Paul's parsonage, Brampton, Melville, the younger son of Rev. Mr. Rankin, formerly of Toronto, fell through a hole in the floor of the loft, striking his

head. He was unconscious for a long time, but now there are hopes of his recovery. Detectives Campau and Mahony, of Windsor, on Saturday arrested Daniel Bartley, living near Edgar Station, on the charge of assaulting at the point of a revolver Miss Miers, his niece. The girl is

about 18 years old; Bartley is about 40 vears. John H. Murden, messenger for the Canadian Express Company at Hamilton. who is out on bail waiting trial on the charge of stealing \$1,500 from the express company, was arrested Friday night or three more charges of stealing \$35 from the

The legislation committee of the Toronto City Council has decided to ask that in the city bill coming up at this session of the Legislature a provision be incorporated preventing the taking of a vote on the Sunday car question until 1896, and preventing its being thereafter taken except in intervals of four years.

IN BRAZIL. A Great Naval Battle Believed to be Im-

minent-Reports of a Rebel Defeat. RIO DE JANEIRO, March 11.-The entire fleet of vessels which were purchased by the Brazilian Government to replace the warships seized by Admiral Mello and Da Gama have arrived outside the harbor. It is expected that their arrival will result in a decisive action at once, which will bring the hostilities to a close. Whether the termination of the revolution will be brought about by a naval battle, a compromise or an unconditional surrender will doubtless

be known very soon.

The Government fleet consists of the dynamite cruiser Nictheroy, the Piratiny, America, the Bahia and the Tiradents and five torpedo boats purchased in Germany. New York, March 11.—Dispatches have been received confirming the reports previously cabled of a battle near Sarrandia,

The rebels were routed with great loss, more than 400 were killed, including many officers.

Heavy Snow Storm. ST. PAUL, March 11,-A heavy snow storm prevailed here yesterday, accompanied by high winds. Reports show that the storm was quite general throughout the State and in North and South Dakota.
