EXPECT 5,000 PEOPLE
AT C. P. R. DIVISIONAL
PICNIC AT SPRINGBANK

Special Trains Will Bring Visitors to
City Early Thursday.

All arrangements for the C. P. R. divisional picnic, which is to be held in Springbank on Thursday, have been completed. Provisions have been made to entertain at least 5,000 employees of the road from this city and all other points between Windsor, Toronto and Goderich. Extra equipment on all trains arriving in the city during the morning and early afternoon, which will be met at the station by special Springbank cars, will provide accommodation for incoming crowds. At night a special train will leave for Goderich by way of Guelph Junction.

The officials in charge of the outing are as follows: Honorary President Superintendent R. McKillop, President J. H. Mills, Secretary E. A. Cody, Treasurer B. T. Riddalls; chairman of sports committee, A. Millikin; refreshment committee, B. T. Riddalls; music committee, J. H. Shaw. The judges will be chosen on the grounds.

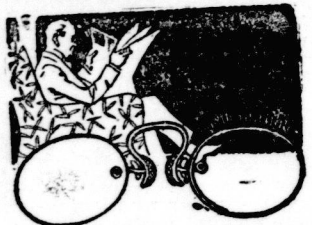

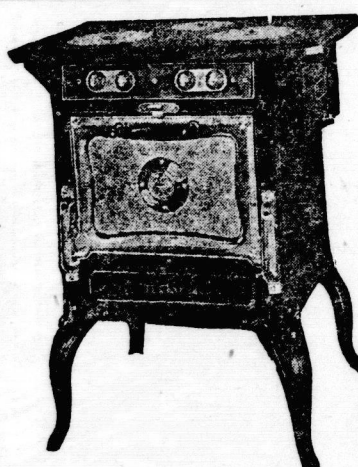

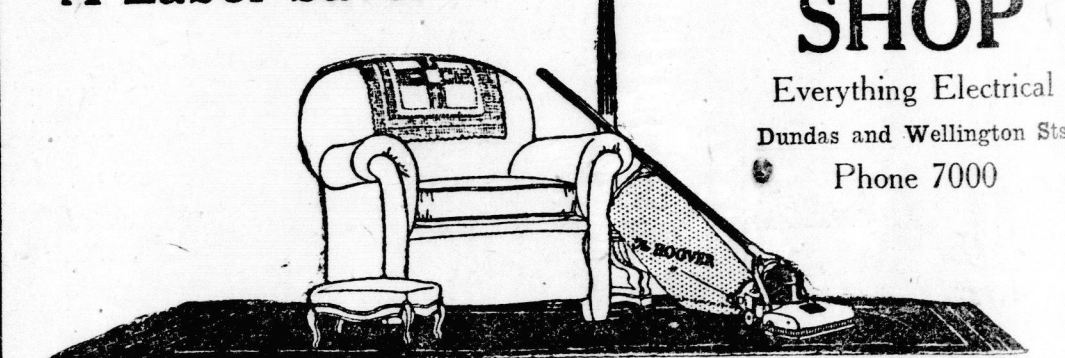

BRITISH EX-SOLDIER
SAYS HE WAS URGED
TO COME TO CANADA

Declares He Told Immigration Authorities He Was Not Farmer.

Sent out to Canada by the soldiers' settlement board, and arriving here, May 16, an ex-imperial soldier, told The Advertiser that he has ever since tramped the streets looking in vain for any kind of work in London. He has a wife and one child, and complains that

he cannot even get 20 cents a day to buy milk for the child.

He declares he distinctly told the immigration officers and also the settlement board in England that his trade was that of locomotive fireman, and that he did not wish to work on a farm. They assured him, however, that it would be quite all right for him to come to Canada, that there was plenty of work here in his line, and that even farm laborers received \$50 to \$60 a month. He is an entire stranger, with no friends at all in this country.

As a matter of fact, according to prominent freight men, who have been closely concerned with cattle shipments for a number of years, the boat is on the other foot. The boats carrying cattle out of this port are not owned by American firms, but by Canadian and British exclusively, and the shippers who gain the most by routing their cattle via Montreal are the Canadians, not the Americans.
