

Of Interest To Horsemen

Description of Horses Required by the Imperial Government for South Africa.

Colonel Dent Purchasing Agent Will Buy at Kamloops and Vernon.

Further correspondence, on the subject of Colonel Dent's visit to the province to purchase horses for the Imperial forces in South Africa, has been received by Mr. J. R. Anderson, deputy minister of agriculture:

Regina, N. W. T., July 2, 1901.
My Dear Sir,—When writing to you on the 27th ult. respecting Colonel Dent's visit to Kamloops and Vernon, I omitted to state the class of horse the colonel will be prepared to purchase, and now enclose a few copies of a circular which was issued by the Imperial Horse Breeders' association some time ago, and which fully sets forth the type of horses Col. Dent is looking for.

The following letter has been received by Mr. C. W. Peterson, secretary of the Imperial Horse Breeders' association, from the chief stock inspector at Montreal, real, Dr. McEachern, bearing upon the mission of the purchasing party sent out by the war office authorities for the purpose of obtaining remounts in Canada:

"Colonel Dent will visit Alberta and other parts of the North West Territories for the purpose of purchasing horses for the army in South Africa. He will send 1,000 immediately, and he will spend April in Ontario and Quebec; he will arrive in Alberta early in May. The dates and purposes of his visit are arranged and published later. The following are the particulars as to horses required:

Cobs 14-2 hands to 15 hands, cavalry horses 15.1 to 15.2 hands high. No horses under six years this summer will be bought. The colors are restricted to bay, brown, black, chestnut, or dark iron gray, if the animal is exceptionally good, may be considered, but white or light gray need not be shown. Mares and geldings only; stallions or ridgelines need not be shown. Horses should be thoroughly broken to ride, be bridle-wise, and gentle to saddle, mount and dismount. They should be sound, and which are thin in flesh need not be shown.

As secretary of the Horse Breeders' association, I presume you will give the above publicity, and I trust that should late in beginning we will be able to dispose of large number of Alberta horses, and that Col. Dent will be favorably impressed with the horses, country, and people; as on his report will depend the establishment or not of a remount depot in Alberta and the continuance of purchasing there."

It is possible that Col. Dent may be authorized to accept horses for immediate service in the field up to 13 or 14 years of age, with proper guarantee of age from the seller.

RECEPTION TO DUKE.
Initial Steps Taken by the Committee of Management.

The Lieutenant-Governor told what the government intended to do, and said that the Royal party would arrive on October 1, and leave on the 3rd.

It was moved by Col. Gregory and seconded that there be a review of the school children to take place in conjunction with the opening of the exhibition. This was carried.

A general discussion followed as to the programme, and it was finally moved by Mr. McPhillips that the committee of seven be chosen by the mayor to map out a programme. Mr. W. H. Price was asked to seek the co-operation of the Board of the Friendly Societies.

LABORERS STRIKE.
Men at Esquimalt Marine Railway Want Advance in Their Wages.

Some forty of the sixty men engaged in "chipping" the ship, the Polkathloch, which went out on strike yesterday. They have been receiving 25 cents an hour, and asked that it be increased to 30 cents an hour. The dissatisfaction was started through the fact that the longshoremen, who are organized are receiving 40 cents an hour and their fair fare paid. The "chippers" thought that their work was worth at least more than half of what the longshoremen receive, and consequently went out on strike. They say on which they are engaged, and many of them are members of the marine firemen's and other unions. The company contend that the work done by the "chippers" is not to be compared with that done by the longshoremen. As soon as the men struck more men were advertised for, but unless they can be secured the balance of the repairs will be made at Portland where the ship goes to load wheat. It is expected that a sufficient number of men will be secured today to complete the work.
