Mr. E. C. Crowell has returned to Bridgetown, after having spent several weeks at his home in Shelburne County, and is now preparing to clean, press and repair clothing at his rooms on Queen street.

Alexander MacKay, Supervisor of the Halifax Schools for the last thirty-five years, died on the 8th inst. He was a guide, philosopher and friend to scores of teachers and thousands of boys and girls who passed through the public schools of the city.

The death of Capt. J. Albert DeLap of Granville Ferry took place at Barbadocs, of Bright's disease, on April 7th. He was sixty-six years of age and leaves a widow and one son in New Jersey. It is probable that the remains will be brought to Granville Ferry for burial.

The young hero will be remembered by many in Bridgetown, he having been employed in the construction of the present passenger bridge which spans the river, and his father was the contractor.

The annual meeting of the members of the Riverside Cemetery will be held in Warren's Hall, Tuesday evening, April 17th, at 7.30 o'clock, at which meeting seven directors shall be chosen by ballot for the ensuing year, and the retiring directors shall make a written report of their doings to the 31st day of March, 1917, with an account of receipts and expenses, showing the financial state of the Corporation. Yesterday's war despatches tell of another big engagement on the Western front, in which the British frustrated the enemy's plans and are threatening the Hindenburg line of defence. The Canadian troops did splendid work, were given the place of honor in the great drive, and supported by some of the most famous British regiments, they captured the crest of Vimy Ridge, the strongest defensive position of the enemy on the Western front. Over 6,000 prisoners were captured, besides vast quantities of war material, including machine guns and trench mortars.

The Riverside Cemetery Birthday party promises to be an unusual and interesting one. Generous contributions and encouraging messages are being received daily from absent friends, which are gratifying and stimulating to home workers. Come and hear them. All are welcome; a voluntary contribution is the admission fee; no tickets. Over 100 lots have been cleared of all taxes and old dues during the year.
