### LAST DAY.

UTICA, Aug. 21.—The conclusion of the Utica Park Association meeting was a grand field day. The weather was remarkably fine, and the track in the track in the best possible condition. Over fifteen thousand persons were present. The day's sport opened at 2 p.m., and closed, with the final heat of the 2:34 race, just before dark.

The winners were Rarus, favorite in the 2:27 race, Goldsmith Maid, in the free for all, and Jno W F all in the 2:34.

In the 2:27 race Bertie was second, Bonner third, Carrio fourth, Eva fifth. Time—2:23, none recorded, 2:25, 2:23, and 2:23. Bonner name in first in the second heat, but was set back for running.

The free for all was won by Goldsmith Maid, in three straight heats, American Girl second. Lula was distanced in the third heat. Time—2:18 1/2, 2:17 1/2, 2:16.

In the 2:34 race, won by J W Hall, Nerea was second, Unknown third, Frank Munson fourth, Tearaway fifth. Time—2:25, 2:25, 2:27, 2:31.

The four-year-old Governor Sprague made a beautiful trial heat in the following time.—quarter, 35 1/2; half, 1:10; three-quarters, 1:46; mile, 2:21 1/2.

The greatest event of the day was the free for all. In the pools the Maid sold at \$100 to 320 to the field. The maid led through the first heat, passing the wire in a walk. It was evident after the first scoring that Lula was amiss. She acted very badly, breaking very often. Previous to the second heat the Maid sold at 3 to 1. In the third heat Lula had the advantage of the start, but the Maid passed her on the turn and kept the lead to the end; though she broke once or twice on the last quarter. Lula acted worse than ever in this heat, breaking, and losing so much time that she was distanced. The Maid's victory caused the wildest excitement. This may be her last appearance on the turf, as Budd Doble thinks she has won her retirement. The whole meeting of the Association has been a brilliant success.
